#### THORNTON TOWNSHIP

#### MOUNT FOREST CEMETERY

The cemetery is on the east side of Chicago Road (South Park Avenue) at about Eleanor Street (approximately 175th Street), Thornton. Mount Forest Cemetery Association was incorporated December 11, 1909, and dissolved May 22, 1939. According to the Thornton Township Assessor's office, the Cook County Forest Preserve allotted 2.51 acres to Mount Forest Cemetery. The cemetery has been maintained by Cook County since 1977. They do not have burial records.

#### MT. FOREST CEMETERY

Mount Forest Cemetery is located on the north side of the village of Thornton at approximately 175th Street and South Park Avenue (Chicago Road). The legal description is the W1/2 SE1/4 Sec 27-36-14 and W1/2 NE1/4 Sec 34-36-14. Its permanent tax identifying numbers are 29-27-401-003 and 29-34-200-001 and for the last tax year it was exempt, paying no taxes. (This is probably because it lies within the forest preserve.)

A plat of the cemetery is found in Plat Book 106, page 24. Its number is 4547742 and it was recorded on April 22, 1910. William Cross was the president and E. S. Worthington the secretary. It was sealed with the corporate seal. The Articles of Incorporation are recorded in the office of the Cook County Recorder. The Association was formed "to purchase and sell real estate for burial purposes only and to own, operate and maintain a cemetery and conduct the incident business therein". It was incorporated by C. O. Garmire, George B. Andrews and Fred V. Sauter. Stockholders were E. S. Worthington, John Allen, C. O. Garmire, Wm. Cross, and Martin Sawtelle. Their mailing address in 1909 was 175 Dearborn, Chicago. There is an additional document in the Recorder's Office, document # 4698202, dated January 1, 1911, titled Increase of Capital Stock which was not examined. A check with the Secretary of States office indicated that the Association was incorporated December 11, 1909 and ceased on May 22, 1939. (File # N-11138292)



## County New Owner Of Thornton Cemeta

Cook county has assumed ownership of the old Mount Forest cemetery in Thornton. The ceme-tery is located on the east side of Chicago road,

tery is located on the east side of Chicago road, south of the Thornwood shopping center, just past the forest preserve clearing.

Since all owners of the cemetery are deceased, ownership has reverted back to the county, along with a list of who is buried there.

The county began clearing the land in July, and is planning to landscape the area and reset the existing markers. They are also planning to erect a seven-foot cyclone fence around the area.

According to Tom Beck, county comptroller, trustees of the cemetery committee for the county are considering using the cemetery for burial of indigent veterans, but plans have not been finalized. Possibly, members of the veterans' families, including parents and wives, would be buried there also.

All improvements are being financed by federal funds, Beck said.

Melba Quade, Thornton, has lived across from Mount Forest cemetery 12 years: She was in the cemetery looking for interesting grave markers with early dates.
